Proposed Bylaws Change at Annual Meeting

At our annual meeting on October 28, we will receive the report from the Nominating Committee to elect officers and board members who will begin service on January 1, 2019. Upon recommendation of the Nominating Committee, we will also be voting on a Bylaws change which, if passed, would change the name of the Personnel Board to the Human Resources Board. This change is supported by the Personnel Board. The Executive Council voted at their October meeting to bring this to the church membership for approval.

To allow for the conservation of resources, we will not circulate written copies of the proposed changes ahead of the meeting. If you wish to plan ahead, we suggest reading the current Bylaws to identify where these changes will occur (for those looking ahead of the meeting, there are 15 locations in the Bylaws where Personnel Board appears). We will have limited copies of the Bylaws at the annual meeting noting the proposed change for those who wish to view it on paper before voting. Please join us on October 28 following worship for this important meeting!

From the Senior Pastor

Over the next five weeks, Plymouth Church is beginning our Fall Stewardship Campaign. The planning team has combined a portion of a passage from 2 Corinthians 4:7: "We have this treasure..." with a line from the gospel hymn "I'm Gonna Live So God Can Use Me." The full verse from 2 Corinthians is "**But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.**"

What this passage means to me is that God can inspire us in ways that extend beyond what we could have imagined on our own. God takes our skill, our energy, our passions, and points us in directions and ministries that we couldn't see by ourselves. We may treasure this congregation for its distinctive stance for justice and inclusion. We may treasure the relationships and sense of belonging that we have received here, whether recently or for decades. But the treasure of the gospel we have received is one that is most worthwhile when we share it.

Our world is beset daily by bad news: of lives dismissed, of dignity denied, of compassion withheld. We have been entrusted by God to share the treasure of the good news of God's love and justice not just for ourselves, but for all our sisters and brothers who need to hear a word of hope to the challenges they face. We have this treasure... so God can use us!

November 11 is Commitment Sunday for Plymouth Church. I encourage you to be as generous with your support as God so leads you. Please pray about how your commitment can enhance the work that the Spirit is already doing here. Each of us can meaningfully contribute to the work of the gospel. Through our time, talent, and treasure, may we give in such a way that God can use us for God's glory!

Peace & Justice Committee Members Attend Workshop

On September 12, 2018, several Plymouth Church members of the Peace and Justice Committee attended a workshop presented by Center for Congregations, Inc. here in Fort Wayne. In attendance were Jan Evrard, Monty Millage, Carol Patterson and Mary Bir.

The workshop was entitled "Racial Justice and Your Congregation." There were many denominations and also some organizations represented there. The very engaging guest speaker was Michael R. Twyman, PhD, who is an associate faculty member of the IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy and teaches courses on race and social justice.

The workshop consisted of talks and video and a great deal of participant interaction which included opportunities for getting to know one another and our various affiliations. A notable example of one group represented there was an entire church whose members moved from Battle Creek, MI to Fort Wayne, IN in a major relocation.

The Center for Congregations, Inc. has a locally-present staff and a visitor-friendly location where church members can obtain support for our efforts in being proponents of racial justice in our churches in Fort Wayne and Indiana and surrounding areas.

SUNDAY MORNING ADULT CLASS NOVEMBER- DECEMBER

Pam Etheridge, Linda Kerr, Vicki Kruse, and Cher Phelps-Griswold recently traveled with Dr. Michael Spath on his 14th “solidarity tour” to Palestine and Israel in which they met with the “Living Stones,” Jewish, Christian, and Muslim religious, political, and NGO leaders working for a just peace and full human and political rights.

In Sunday morning Adult Class on November 4, 11, 18, and December 2 (no class on November 25), Pam, Linda, Vicki, Cher, and Michael will share what they learned, the people with whom they met, the issues they confronted, implications of US policies, and the up-to-the-minute news that was breaking while they traveled.

In the December 9 class, Rev. Graylan Hagler, Senior Minister at Plymouth Congregational Church UCC, Washington DC, will be present to talk about the intersection between the *Black Lives Movement* and the Palestinian liberation struggle (both of which he is a leader in Washington DC and throughout the United Church of Christ nationally).

Rev. Hagler is in Fort Wayne at the invitation of the *Indiana Center for Middle East Peace*. He will be the keynote speaker on Sunday evening, December 9, at ICMEP’s “Service of Solidarity” commemorating the United Nations *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* at Plymouth Church 6:30 pm.

Plymouth Church stands tall in northeast Indiana, built firmly on a foundation of its four identifying pillars: providing a safe, opening and affirming space for LGBTQ community members and their families; being a just-peace congregation; Earthwise, emphasizing the sustainability and care of the planet; and a missional church, intensely local, intentionally global. Plymouth models a progressive spiritual community, whose celebration of diversity, wide welcome, sacrificial service, and prophetic voice all model Martin Luther King, Jr.’s ‘beloved community,’ all based in the ethic of Jesus.

Plymouth Church has been a partner with ICMEP from our inception, hosting our first programs, and in the ensuing years, over half of our programs, more than 120 in all, including lectures, concerts, performances, and exhibits. Plymouth’s generous hospitality has provided ICMEP a ‘home’ where intersectional liberative voices are valued. It has financially supported our work, held classes on liberation theology, justice, and human rights in Palestine and Israel, encouraged members to participate in ICMEP-sponsored ‘solidarity tours,’ and courageously stood firm in our support in the face of outside opposition.

Plymouth Church has also financially supported Christian ministries in Palestine, including *Mar Elias Educational Institutions*, *Wi’am Conflict Resolution and Transformation Center*, *Bright Stars of Bethlehem*, and others.

Finally, Plymouth Church is a leader within the United Church of Christ denomination in promoting resolutions supporting the *Kairos Palestine* document, the *Palestinian Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions Movement*, as well as protesting Israel’s mistreatment of Palestinian children.

For these reasons, and more, *Indiana Center for Middle East Peace* expresses its gratitude for the partnership of Plymouth Congregational Church United Church of Christ and grants its *Tree of Life* “Champion of Justice” Award to it.

Mahnin Asia Restaurant, 2701 S. Calhoun St., 46807

On the evening of September 21, 2018, several Peace & Justice Committee members visited Mahnin to sample the menu of Thai and Burmese food. Although best described as a quaint “hole in the wall” environment, this did not detract from the delicious food and good service. Here is a review as written by Jane Meredith:

“I ordered Som Tum, a spicy papaya and seafood salad with the papaya cut “shoestring” style and served in a vinaigrette style dressing. It also came with three batter-dipped chicken wings that were absolutely delicious—melt in the mouth deep fried batter, perfectly seasoned. I also ordered Gan Masaman with pork, a savory curry dinner with potatoes, onions, and peanuts in a thickened coconut milk soup. It too, was delicious. All was accompanied by a starter bowl of chicken broth and green onions and delicate jasmine tea. The portion sizes gave us all an extra lunch for the next day.”

Parking Lot Hang Tags Available Through the Church Office During Office Hours

Due to the increased activity downtown and the limited parking available, all Plymouth members and staff are expected to display a yellow Parking Lot Hang Tag when parking in Plymouth's parking lots for Plymouth activities. This will clearly let the staff know that you are a Plymouth member parking on the Plymouth property.

You will need to provide your name and a phone number at the time of receiving a parking tag. This information will be associated with the tag number you are given and will be kept on file in the church office.

If you still have an old yellow parking hang tag, either write down the number or bring the tag number to the church office, or email it to Laura Rudolph, rudyfw@yahoo.com, along with your name and contact phone number, so that this information can be entered into the database.

Please take the opportunity to become familiar with the Plymouth Parking Lot Policy that was created by the Property Board and presented to the Executive Council in July 2018.

Plymouth Parking Lot Policy

1. All members and staff of Plymouth church who desire a Parking Hang Tag will be issued one.
2. The Parking Hang Tag is to be displayed at all times on the rear-view mirror on the inside of the front windshield of the vehicle with the numbers facing out so they can be easily read.
3. This Parking Hang Tag is for the express use of parking during Plymouth Church activities or events in Plymouth's parking lot located on the NW corner of Berry St. and Fairfield Ave. and the parking area on the west side of the church.
4. Cars without Hang Tags displayed will have a notice placed on them reminding them to have the Hang Tag displayed or risk towing at the owner's expense.
5. Cars without Parking Hang Tags will be towed at the direction of the church staff.
6. Parking Hang Tags are available through the church office during business hours.
7. A master list of Parking Hang Tag numbers and the associated names will be maintained by the church office.
8. Should a Parking Hang Tag require replacement for any reason, a donation to Plymouth Church is requested.
9. Temporary Parking Hang Tags will be issued to contractors by the church office as needed.
