From the Senior Pastor

There are different ways to measure time. There are New Year's celebrations on December 31 and January 1. There are birthdays that mark the start of a new personal year. There is the church's program year, which begins at the end of summer in September. But one additional marker is the church liturgical year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost. This is the cycle of church seasons. And it just so happens that we will begin a new year with the start of Advent on Sunday, December 1.

The months of "ordinary time" that takes place after Pentecost concludes and with the new liturgical year we start the cycle over again. Advent's four weeks help us prepare for celebrating the birth of Jesus and the incarnation of God-with-us in our world at Christmas. The colors change, with royal blue the color of Advent (expect to see different stoles). We also place Christmas decorations around the sanctuary and building. And we light candles in worship weekly around the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love.

Each Advent, we have a particular theme. This year's will be "Welcoming the Holy Family." Expect to see bulletin covers

that depict images of the Holy Family from across cultures and around the planet. This is to remind us that the best way to welcome the coming of Jesus our Christ is by showing that welcome to our brothers, sisters, and siblings of different backgrounds, cultures, races, and identities. It reminds us that God-with-us means that the divine presence is revealed through one another.

At your reception of this Bell, the cultural holiday season will be in full swing (I have heard anecdotally that people have heard Christmas music at stores and seen Christmas decorations for sale even prior to Halloween, yikes!). In the midst of the busyness, I hope that you will find moments during the month of December to slow down and consider how you can personally welcome the Holy Family in your life.

Blessing during this Advent season, and may you be filled with hope, peace, joy, and love!

\$\$\$ Grants/Scholarship Opportunities **\$\$\$** FOR TUITION AND FEES FOR ACADEMIC CREDIT

The Grants and Scholarships Committee has the pleasant responsibility of awarding scholarship grants for tuition and fees for academic credit from the earnings generated by several endowed funds.

Applications due in the church office by February 15:

The **Richard Nelson Kent Memorial Fund** provides educational grants for tuition and fees for academic credit for members of the United Church of Christ in the Northeast [Indiana] Association and other qualified applicants who are at least 16 years of age and entering into or continuing ecological studies, conservation biology, or other environmentally related studies.

The **R. Donald and Genevieve M. Sinish Fund** provides awards for tuition and fees for academic credit for 16-24-year-old members of Plymouth Church.

The **Van Gorder Scholarship Fund** is awarded annually for tuition and fees for post-secondary education leading to a degree, certificate, or license for a graduating senior who is a member of Plymouth Church.

Applications due in the church office by April 15:

The **Richard C. Hess Peace Studies Scholarship Fund** provides a \$1,000 scholarship for tuition and fees for academic credit for a college student majoring in peace studies or a related program.

Completed applications for grants/scholarships for tuition and fees for academic credit with all supporting materials must be received in the church office by the respective due dates. Incomplete applications are ineligible for consideration.

To request application packets for these funds or to receive additional information, call the church office (260-423-9424) and leave your name, phone number, and email address so one of the members of the Grants and Scholarships Committee can respond to your request.

Pronoun Stickers Coming Soon!

As an Open and Affirming congregation offering welcome to the LGBTQ+ community, it is important that we celebrate and affirm not only "LGB" persons as beloved, but intentionally include "TQ+" persons in that celebration as well.



Over the past several months, the Gender Identity Task Force held two workshops on better understanding gender identity. During these discussions, we learned how important it is to respect the pronouns people use to reflect their identity and that offering your own pronouns first can help create a safe and welcoming space for others to do the same. To help Plymouth members, and any visitors who are so inclined, offer their pronouns, the E&M Board has ordered small pronoun stickers that can be placed on your name tag (or shirt, if you don't have a name tag). Our hope is that these stickers will arrive in time for the holiday season.

Be on the lookout for them in the narthex, and help us make it clear that Plymouth is a safe place to be who you are.

FW Pride's Holiday Family sponsorship has returned for its 3rd year. Eighty-nine individuals were helped over the past two years through this program! We have a record number of LGBTQ families needing help this Christmas who were referred by coworkers, guidance counselors, friends, and family. Many of these families have been turned away by other churches because they are LGBTQ. A couple recently lost jobs because they are LGBTQ. Some families are headed by same sex parents while others have LGBTQ children. Most of these families have teenage children.

Pride wants to be able to match every teen and child with a sponsor. If you signed up last year, then you already received details via email. If you want to provide gifts for a teen/child, the estimated total cost is \$75 to purchase two-three needs and one want as gifts. Plymouth Church's name will be given to each teen and family so they know Plymouth is an Open and Affirming congregation (and what that means) and that we would love for families to check it out. They will know that support was given by not only Pride, but members of Plymouth. They also receive information regarding community resources to help their family.
